

Types of Cases – Minor Offenses

Minor offense cases are cases that usually result in the issuance of a fine that is less than \$500.00 and may not result in any prison time. See [Minor Offense Rule 2](#) for a complete definition of minor offense cases.

Minor Offenses include, but are not limited to, the following:

- (1) Vehicle and traffic offenses listed in [Administrative Rule 43.1](#) (or in a municipal fine schedule ordinance).
- (2) Fish and game offenses listed in [Administrative Rule 43.2](#)
- (3) Offenses committed within a park or recreational facility listed in [Administrative Rule 43.3](#)
- (4) Violations of laws prohibiting smoking in public places listed in [Administrative Rule 43.4](#)
- (5) Possession of an alcoholic beverage in a community which has voted in a local option election to prohibit such possession. AS 04.16.205(c) and [Administrative Rule 43.5](#).
- (6) Oversize vehicle offenses listed in [Administrative Rule 43.6](#).
- (7) Violation of laws requiring posting of warning signs listed in [Administrative Rule 43.7](#).
- (8) Watercraft offenses listed in [Administrative Rule 43.8](#).
- (9) Skiing offenses listed in [Administrative Rule 43.9](#).
- (10) Knik River Public Use Area offenses listed in [Administrative Rule 43.10](#).
- (11) Weights and measures offenses listed in [Administrative Rule 43.11](#).
