

IN THE SUPREME COURT OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

ORDER NO. 1190

The Board of Governors of the Alaska Bar Association has advised this court that the Association is trying to determine whether there is a need for minimum financial responsibility rules for the practice of law in Alaska. The Board is looking to determine the existing level of malpractice insurance coverage among private practitioners and the membership's opinion regarding mandatory malpractice insurance and various frameworks to provide protection to the public.

IT IS ORDERED:

The court respectfully requests and directs each active member of the Alaska Bar Association to respond by April 1, 1995 to a survey to be distributed by the Association in an effort to determine the need for minimum financial responsibility. Responses to the survey shall be handled in such a manner that the anonymity of the respondents is assured.
